The **GIVING TREE** is back. ~ Our church has a long tradition of supporting those in need, and this Christmas Season, the demand continues to be great. The Giving Tree will support children at WAEC and BWMS. These gifts are given to parents for children to receive on Christmas morning. Each child has suggested pieces of clothing with the appropriate sizes. We suggest that when purchasing pants for girls you look at leggings or athletic pants with the elastic waist. For the boys we also suggest athletic pants and not jeans as it's a safer fit to not have a specific waist size. Each child also has a suggested toy or interest item. You do not need to buy multiple items for each child but that is up to you. This year we put the child's first name on the tag and underlined it. You may put that name on the package if you wish. Each family also has the same color tag if you are looking for a family. Please write your name on the number that corresponds to your gift tag on the sheet beside the Giving Tree, shop, wrap your gift, and tape the tag onto the package. Return the package to the office or music room no later than December 14th. This year, since groceries have also gotten so expensive, we hope to provide each family with a nice food box. Please leave food items in the container under the bulletin board. Items needed include boxes of cereal, peanut butter, jelly, canned soups, vegetables, and fruits, spaghetti sauce and pasta. In addition, we hope to give each family a gift card to Aldis for perishable items. If you wish to donate to the gift cards, please leave the money in the office mailbox marked Christmas Food Box or give to one of the secretaries.
