Luke 2:14

In 1958 we were stationed in Bad Canstatt, Germany as part of a two year stint with the U.S. Army. That December, as Christmas approached, we were both feeling homesick and lonely as this was the first time either of us had spent Christmas away from our families.

We decided to attend the Christmas Eve Service at the little chapel attached to the Army base. Since we did not qualify for housing, we lived with a German family about a mile away and had to trek up a steep hill to the base chapel. I don't remember much about the service that evening; I am sure it was the usual message and usual carols for a Christmas Eve. As we came out of the chapel it was cold, and still; not a sound could be heard and being on top of a hill we had the most magnificent view of the stars that I have ever seen. One could not help but think, "Was this what it was like the first Christmas Eve?" You could almost, with anticipation, vision the heavens opening up and hear the message of the angels to the shepherds.

It finally came to me that although Christmas is so filled with family, friends and familiar traditions, the true spirit is the wonder of that night and the glorious gift that was given to all who open their hearts and accept this. The spirit of Christmas is with us, no matter where we are.
