

On Ash Wednesday (March 5th), we begin the holy season of Lent. Lent is a forty-day time of preparation for Easter. This year, First Methodist Church wants to be especially attentive to "HOW" we choose to prepare for Easter.

A word that is often used this time of year is "Repent." To repent literally means to "turn back from". The season of Lent is meant to help us "turn back" or away from our sinfulness and towards our God. We are given the opportunity to turn away from doing the things that are not of God and return to God.

One of the most important things we can do is pray. In fact, we believe prayer to be so important that we are offering a six week study on prayer during the six weeks of Lent. Last fall nearly 50 members of our church participated in our "Christian to the Core" study that focused us on the fundamental pieces of our life in Christ that help us be the church.

This study on prayer entitled "Prayer Begins with Relationship" is an excellent next step for many who participated previously. We would strongly encourage you to consider committing six weeks to this study. Dr. Hecht will be leading this study that will help the participant grow deeper in their personal relationship with God through prayer.

Classes will once again meet on Monday Evenings and Tuesday Afternoons. Each class will be 75 minutes in length.

As a community of faith, we are all invited to do our best to spend time in worship, personal reflection and the reading of the scriptures. This season we invite you to seriously focus also on PRAYER.

May we take this time to learn more about God and God's ways and respond in faith.
