

Share Your Spare



My name is Erica Wellner and I am the pastor of Scalp Level Trinity and Windber Calvary (Global) Methodist Churches and I need a new kidney.

On April 2, 2024 I went to the ER with what I thought was possible heart issues. I would learn later that evening that I am in end stage kidney failure. I spent a week in the hospital under observation. Upon coming home, I was placed on dialysis three days a week. While this is helping my condition, my medical team has said that my best treatment plan is getting a new kidney. While I can receive a cadaver kidney, it would be best for someone my age to receive from a live donor.

Did you know you only need one kidney to live a normal life? My blood type is O+, and while having an O+ donor would be great, thanks to the National Kidney Registry, anyone can donate on my behalf and through the Registry I will receive a kidney that best matches my genetic makeup.

If you are interested in learning more about becoming a donor, please call my living donor coordinator, Torrey at 412-359-4441 and she can answer any questions you may have. If you don't feel called to donate, can you please spread the word. You will not only benefit me, but many others who are in need of a kidney to give them back their life.

Who can be a kidney donor?

Donors must be greater than 18 years old. They must not have a history of active cancer, diabetes or chronic kidney stones. There is a weight limit depending on the age of the donor.

Donors have to be in good physical health and free of cardiac and pulmonary disease. We screen donors carefully for medical and renal diseases. We also consider a potential donor's risk factors for developing future kidney disease (such as hypertension and obesity).

Donors need to be up to date with colon cancer and breast cancer screenings. We require donors to be non-smokers or to quit smoking at least 6 weeks prior to surgery.

Donors cannot have severe untreated mental health issues. People with HIV or hepatitis cannot be kidney donors at this time.



The Donation Process

Pre-operative evaluation

All donors are carefully screened for medical and infectious diseases during an initial consultation. You will meet with the surgeon and the nephrologist. At this appointment you will be asked detailed questions about your medical and surgical history. You will also begin the testing process including blood and kidney function tests.

Surgery

Surgery is often scheduled on a day selected by the donor. The surgery is performed through small incisions using the newest robotic technology. A bladder catheter is placed during surgery and remains overnight. Donors typically spend 1-2 nights in the hospital. You will be out of bed and walking on the first day.

Recovery

Recovery takes 2-6 weeks after which you can return to normal activities. You will be given pain medication and stool softeners to take at home as needed. There are no dietary restrictions after donation. You will have a follow up appointment two weeks after surgery.
